The Youth Development Strategy

Boys & Girls Club programs promote the development of young people by instilling a sense of competence, a sense of usefulness, a sense of belonging, and a sense of power or influence. When this strategy is fully implemented, self-esteem is enhanced and an environment is created which helps boys and girls achieve their full potential.



Club Core Program Areas

Character & Leadership Development:

Programs in this Core Program Area empower youth to support and influence their Club and community, sustain meaningful relationships with others, develop a positive self image, participate in the democratic process, and respect their own and others' cultural identities.



Education & Career Development:

Programs in this Core Program Area enable youth to become proficient in basic educational disciplines, apply learning to everyday situations, and embrace technology to achieve success in a career.



Health & Life Skills:

Programs in this area develop young people's capacity to engage in positive behaviors that nurture their own well-being, help them set personal goals, and live successfully as self-sufficient adults.



Sports, Fitness & Recreation:

Programs in this area develop fitness, positive use of leisure time, appreciation for the environment, skills for stress management, and social skills.



The Arts:

Programs in this area enable youth to develop their creativity and cultural awareness through knowledge and appreciation of the visual arts, crafts, performing arts, and creative writing.

SMART Moves

Sponsor: Office of Pinal Count Attorney

The SMART Moves prevention and education program addresses the problems of drug and alcohol use and premature sexual activity. Based on proven techniques, the program uses a team approach involving Club staff, peer leaders, parents, and community representatives.



SMART GIRLS

Sponsor: Soroptimist International of Apache Junction

An outgrowth of the popular and effective SMART Moves program, SMART Girls is a health, fitness, prevention and education, and self-esteem enhancement program for girls, ages 8 – 17.



Torch Club

Nationally sponsored by Staples

A small group leadership development program, it is targeted to youngsters ages 11-13. Within some 700 Torch Clubs across the country, members elect officers and plan and implement their own activities and community service projects. Each Torch Club receives an official charter from the Boys & Girls Club of America.



Flag Football

In conjunction with NFL Flag Football, Members play against other Clubs each week in the fall of the year. League is instructional with emphasis on team work, sportsmanship, physical fitness, and life skills.



Soccer

Soccer is offered to any current participating member of the Boys & Girls Club program.



Basketball

Basketball is offered to all members of the Boys & Girls Club. Registration began in October-November 2009 with late sign-up in December 2009 and January 2010. The program is run through the Jr. Suns & Jr. Mercury programs for boys and girls, 6-14.



Cavity Free Zone

Cavity-Free Zone aims to improve the oral health of Club members ages 6 to 18 nationwide through oral health education program materials, a website, and collaborative efforts.

Passport to Manhood

Sponsor: Office of Pinal County Attorney

Passport to Manhood promotes and teaches responsibility while reinforcing positive behavior in male Club members, ages 11 to14.

Project Learn

Project Learn reinforces and enhances the skills and knowledge young people learn at school through "high-yield" learning activities at the Club and in the home.

NetSmartz teaches Internet safety skills through engaging multimedia activities and offline interaction with Club professionals in three age-appropriate modules.

Power Hour

Sponsor: Salt River Project

Power Hour is a comprehensive tutoring and homework assistance program that is designed to raise the academic proficiency of Club members ages 6 to12. MCC & CAC students tutor & mentor members while completing service learning hours.



Triple Play

Triple Play emphasizes good nutrition, regular physical activity, and improving overall well-being.



Keystone Club

Keystone Clubs are small group leadership development clubs for young people ages 14 to18. Members elect officers, choose their own activities, and plan and implement community service projects. 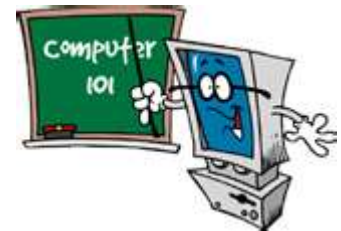
